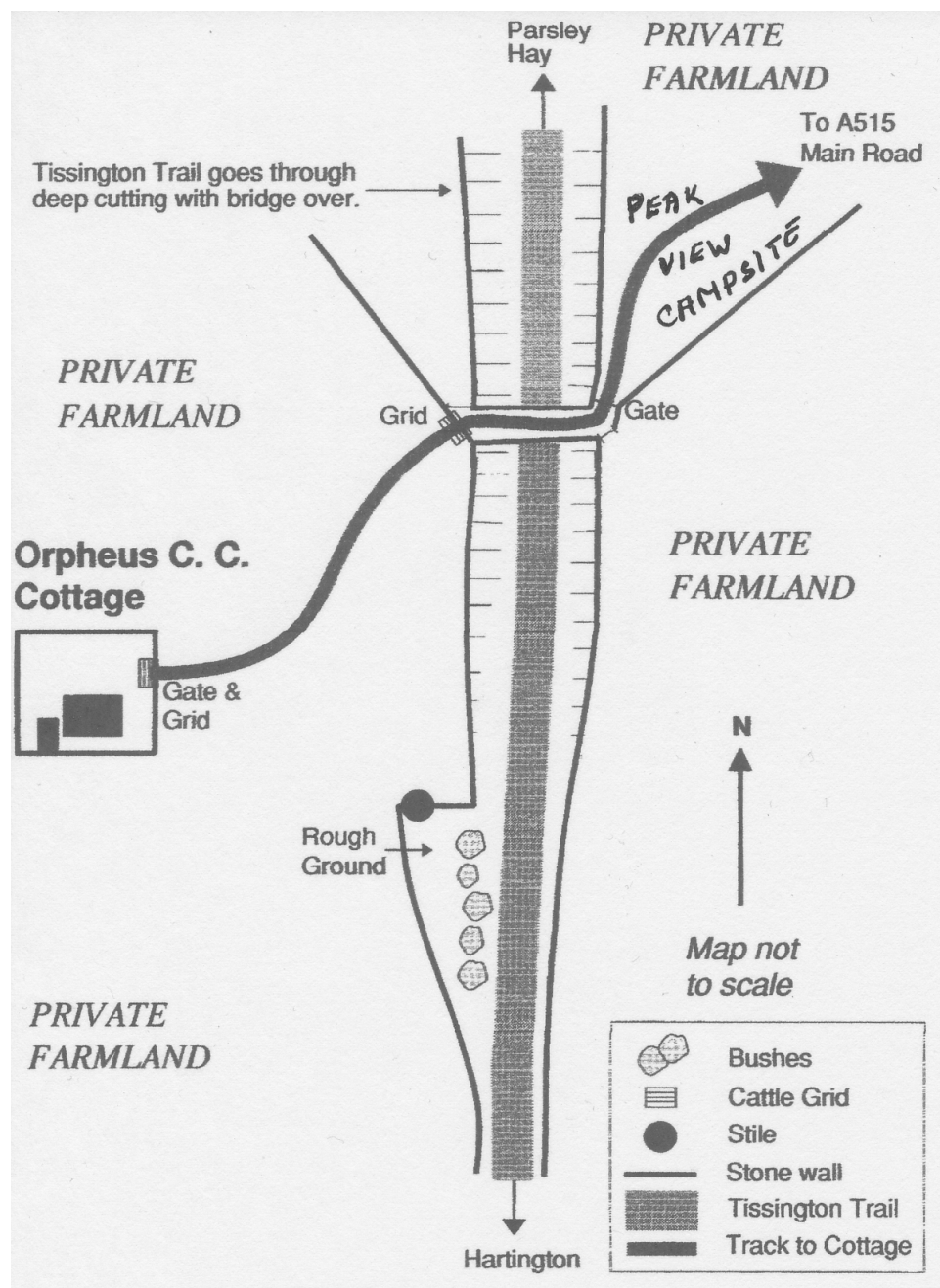


ACCESS AT THE ORPHEUS COTTAGE

Please note that, although it looks as though the Orpheus C.C. Cottage is isolated, we have to be mindful that we are surrounded by farmland with sheep grazing and our right of access is along an unfenced track through two different farms. It is vital that we remain on good terms with our two neighbouring farmers, one of whom lives only 200m away across the field from the Cottage and can hear everything which goes on outside. It is essential that there is no disturbance outside late at night.



- Note that, the unfenced track is our official right of way from the main road to the Cottage.
- Please keep the top gate leading into the Peak View Campsite field open or closed, as you find it.
- Please keep the gate leading onto the bridge closed. The campers who use the Peak View Campsite above the gate do not have permission to cross the bridge to access the Trail. (The “Keep Out” notices on the bridge are to deter them - they don’t apply to OCC members and visitors.)
- Please do not trespass onto the fields surrounding the Cottage or allow children to use the surrounding farmland as a playground. No dogs on the fields.
- If there are children or young people staying and they are playing outside, please ensure that there is an adult outside with them at all times to keep an eye on them.
- Please ensure that no rubbish such as grass-cuttings, plastic bags or unwanted food are thrown over the wall where sheep can get at them,
- Please park cars inside our Cottage compound, not on the fields next to the Cottage. (If there is a need for

overflow parking, you may use the Peak View Campsite field but park close to the wall on the same side as the water point.)

- By special permission of the Farmer, we have our own stile, marked on the map, for Orpheus members and visitors to reach the Trail, there is no other access to the Trail from the Cottage. To prevent casual walkers on the Trail finding the stile it cannot be seen until you get close to it (look for the rough ground below the bushes at the southern end of the deep cutting with the bridge over it). You will see the stone steps cemented into the wall (beware the strand of barbed wire across the top.) There is also a notice at the base of the stile on the Trail side of the wall which says “PRIVATE LAND, No access without permission.”
- Please note that there is no right of way down the dale below the Cottage.
